

■ Icy Roads Kill 10 in a Southern U.S. Deep Freeze

A potent mix of snow and a deep freeze has wrapped the American South in a dangerously icy cocoon, leaving at least 10 people dead from accidents on slick roads, The Associated Press reported.

The storm has dumped about a foot of snow (30 centimeters) on parts of North Carolina, Virginia and Georgia.

Hundreds of flights were canceled at Hartsfield Atlanta International Airport, the nation's busiest. South Carolina's governor declared a state of emergency, called out the National Guard and told tens of thousands of state workers to take the day off Friday.
