BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Constantine Simitis was born in Athens on June 23, 1936. He received his Ph.D. in Law and Economics at the University of Marburg, Federal Republic of Germany in 1959 and continued his studies in Britain at the London School of Economics from 1961 to 1963. Mr. Simitis became an Assistant Professor at the University of Konstanz, Germany in 1971 and then served as Professor of Commercial and Civil Law of the Justice at Liebig University (Glessen) from 1971 to 1975. He has been a Professor of Commercial Law at Pantios School of Political Sciences since 1977. Mr. Simitis has also served as a lawyer at the Supreme Court of Appeals.

Mr. Simitis co-founded the Alexandros Papanastasiou Society for political research and studies in 1965. After escaping to Germany to avoid arrest for his actions against the junta in 1969, he became a member of the National Council of the Panhellenic Liberation Movement (P.A.K.). While in Germany he participated in public meetings held against the dictatorship. He was a founding member of the Panhellenic Socialist Movement (PASOK) in 1974 and became a member of the Central and Executive Committees of PASOK.

Mr. Simitis was appointed Minister of Agriculture in 1981 and became Minister of the National Economy in July of 1985. He served as Member of Parliament for the district of Piraeus from 1985 to 1989. On November 23, 1989 he was appointed Minister of Education.
