Denmark:

National pension (Folkepension):

67 years (65 for those who reach the age of 60 on 1st July 1999 or later).

Supplementary pension (ATP-pension): Persons who reach the age of 60 on 1st July 1999 or later can demand the supplementary pension before the age of 67, but not before the age of 65. Early retirement is reduced by 10% yearly

between 65 and 67 years of age.
