3.1. Legal retirement age: Standard pension

Belgium: Women: 62 years (the age is raised progressively to 65 during a transitory period running from 1997 to 2009);

Men: 65 years.

Denmark: National pension (Folkepension):
67 years (65 for those who reach the age of 60 on 1st July 1999 or later).

Supplementary pension (ATP-pension): Persons who reach the age of 60 on 1st July 1999 or later can demand the supplementary pension before the age of 67, but not before the age of 65. Early retirement is reduced by 10% yearly between 65 and 67 years of age.

Germany: In principle 65 years.

Greece: Persons insured before 31.12.1992:
Men: 65 years
Women: 60 years

Persons insured since 1.1.1993:
Men: 65 years
Women: 65 years

Spain: 65 years.

France: 60 years.

Ireland: Retirement Pension: 65 years.

Old-Age (Contributory) Pension: 66 years.

Iceland: 67 years.

Italy: Men: 65 years;
Women: 60 years.

For those with a disability of at least 80% and for the blind: men: 60 years; women: 55 years.

New system: age 57-65 years. The amount of the benefit varies according to age.

Liechtenstein: First and Second pillar:
Women
Age groups > Age
1935 to 1940 > 62
1941 to 1945 > 63
1946 and younger > 64

Men
Age groups > Age
1935 and older > 65
1936 and younger > 64

In the Second pillar, another retirement age can also be chosen, as long as an insurance plan that is at least equivalent is provided.

Luxembourg: 65 years.

Netherlands: 65 years.

Norway: 67 years.

Austria: 65 years for men.
60 years for women.

Progressive increase of age limit for women until the same retirement age as for men will have been reached between the years 2019 and 2028.

Portugal: Men and women: 65 years.

Finland: 65 years.

Sweden: 65 years.

United

Kingdom: Men: 65 years.
Women: 60 years (gradually rising to 65 over period 2010 and 2020).
