

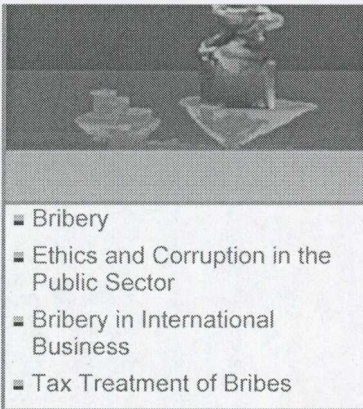

How do Estonia's anti-bribery laws conform to the OECD Anti-Bribery Convention? The Working Group found that overall Estonia implementing legislation conforms to the standards under the Convention. But concerns remain regarding the question of who is a foreign public official, the conditions to trigger the liability of legal persons, and the various possibilities to terminate criminal proceedings related to bribery offences.

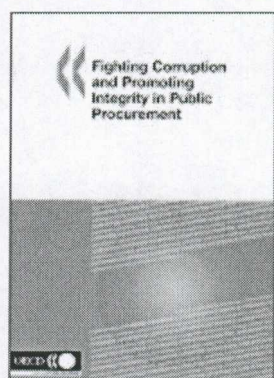

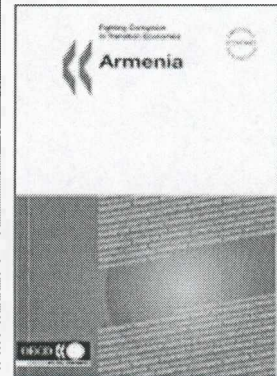
