New Round for Cyprus Talks

UNITED NATIONS, New York — Greek and Turkish Cypriot leaders have agreed to meet again next month in Geneva to continue talks aimed at resolving the 23-year

division of Cyprus, sources said Friday.

The sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the Greek Cypriot president, Glafkos Clerides, and the Turkish Cypriot leader, Rauf Denktash, reached the agreement to meet again Thursday, during the second day of discussions sponsored by the UN in Troutbeck, New York. They said the next round would be held in Geneva from Aug. 11-16. The Troutbeck meeting is expected to last until Sunday. (AP)
