You may remember that during the Progressive Governance Sherpas meeting in Stockholm in November, we left open the dates for the Stockholm progressive governance Summit. There were two possibilities, the weekend of 7/8 September 2001 or the next one (14/15th September).

As I mentioned to you in my letter of November 28, 2000, it is *extremely* important for us that the date be finalised, one way or the other, the soonest possible. The scheduling of major events in our political calendar, including the Opening of the Thessaloniki International Fair, hangs in the balance.
